General Notes

- The minimum cumulative GPA required to apply is 3.0 with a minimum of 90 credit hours completed.
- No grade below a "C" is generally accepted in prerequisite courses.

3+1 Accelerated Pathway

As part of the agreement with Palmer College of Chiropractic and Cleveland Chiropractic College (Biology and Kinesiology) and Logan Chiropractic (Biology), students complete three years of coursework at UNI before transferring to one of these colleges to complete the first-year Chiropractic coursework. Application Process
