Occupational Therapy

Therapeutic use of everyday life occupations with persons, groups, or populations with the goal of enhancing or enabling participation.

Use habilitation, rehabilitation, promotion of health and wellness

Acquisition and preservation of occupational identity for clients.

Practice emphasizes the occupational nature of humans and importance of occupational identity.

Work in a variety of settings: hospitals, schools, clinics, skilled nursing facilities, community centers, health care facilities.

Team includes social workers, mental health practitioners, Physical & Speech Therapists, Nursing, etc.



Occupational Therapy Scope of Practice




Occupational Analysis

Occupational therapists are skilled at Occupational Analysis or Task analysis.

This means that we possess the skills to:

- Determine what is needing to be analyzed
- Determine the relevance/importance to the client
- Determine sequence and timing for the task
- Determine object, space and social demands
- Determine required body functions
- Determine required body structures
- Determine required actions and performance skills (AOTA, 2020)






What is Regulation?



Sensory Integration

- ► "The organization of sensation for use" (a complex function of the brain)
- ► A frame of reference to guide occupational therapy practice with children
 - ► Theory: concepts that promote understanding the child and planning appropriate intervention
 - Assessment methods to determine whether a child has SI problems, and if so, which types
 - ► Intervention strategies designed to improve the child's difficulties with sensory-motor functioning and participation







- Allen OT students and UNI SLP students are paired with a child to provide intervention.
- Students can develop interprofessional skills while gaining hands-on experience with the pediatric population.




